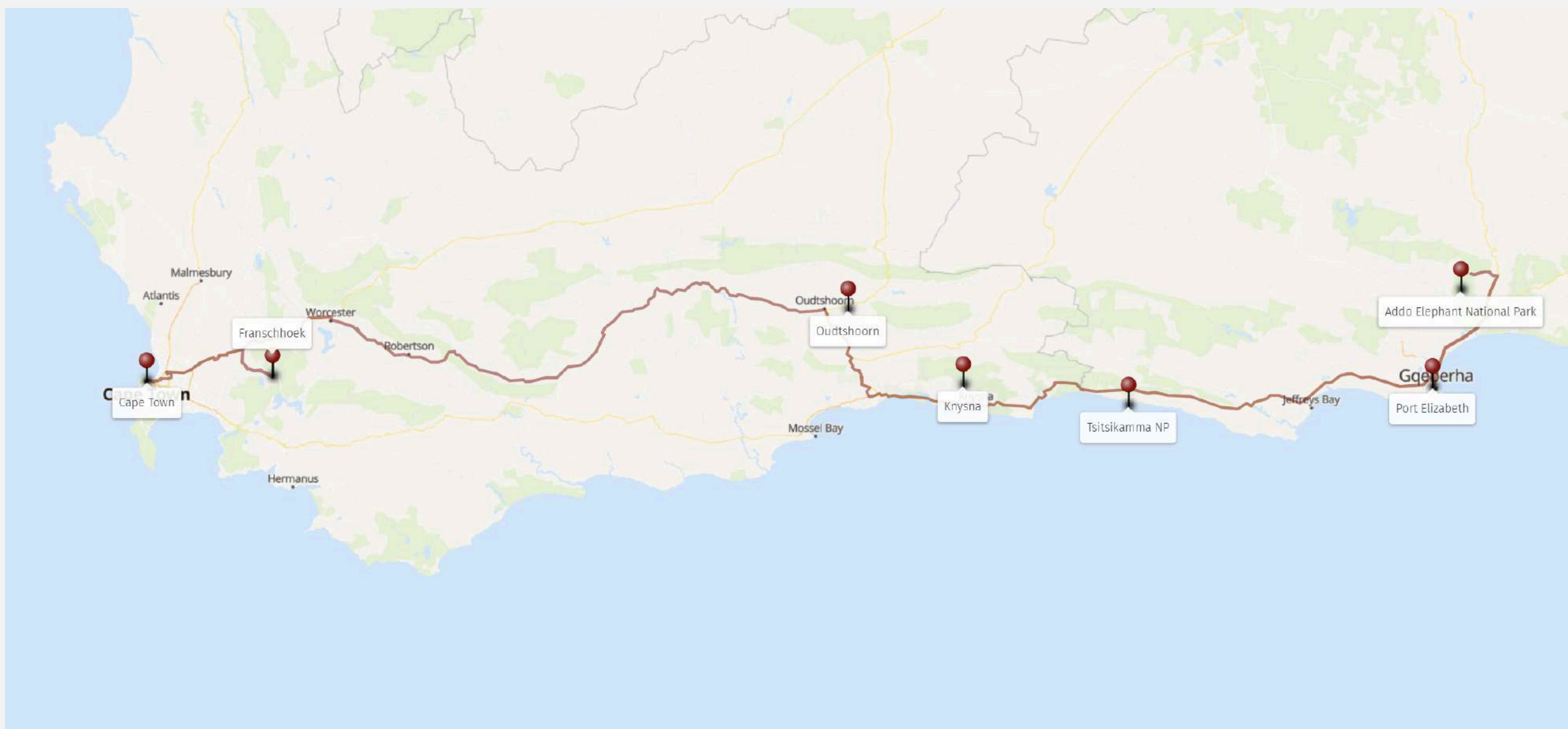




# 14 DAY CAPE TOWN TO ADDO



## CAPE TOWN - FRANSCHHOEK - OUDTSHOORN - KNYSNA - TSITSIKAMMA - ADDO - GQEBERHA

This is South Africa at its most spectacular. Beginning in the vibrant city of Cape Town, this 14-day journey takes you through the vineyards of the Winelands, over the mountains into the Klein Karoo, along the legendary Garden Route and deep into the Eastern Cape to the elephant herds of Addo. Six remarkable destinations, each with its own character, each delivering something genuinely memorable.

# CAPE TOWN

Cape Town is one of the great cities of the world. Backed by the iconic Table Mountain and flanked by two oceans it combines extraordinary natural beauty with a vibrant food and wine scene, a rich and complex history and some of the most spectacular coastal scenery on the continent. Three days here barely scratches the surface, but you will leave with memories that last a lifetime.



## Accommodation

### Lawhill Luxury Apartments (3 Nights)

Your accommodation is right in the heart of the V&A Waterfront, one of the most celebrated waterfronts in the world. The apartments are spacious, well appointed and beautifully positioned, with views over the marina and within easy walking distance of the best restaurants, shops and attractions the city has to offer. It is a superb base from which to explore Cape Town.

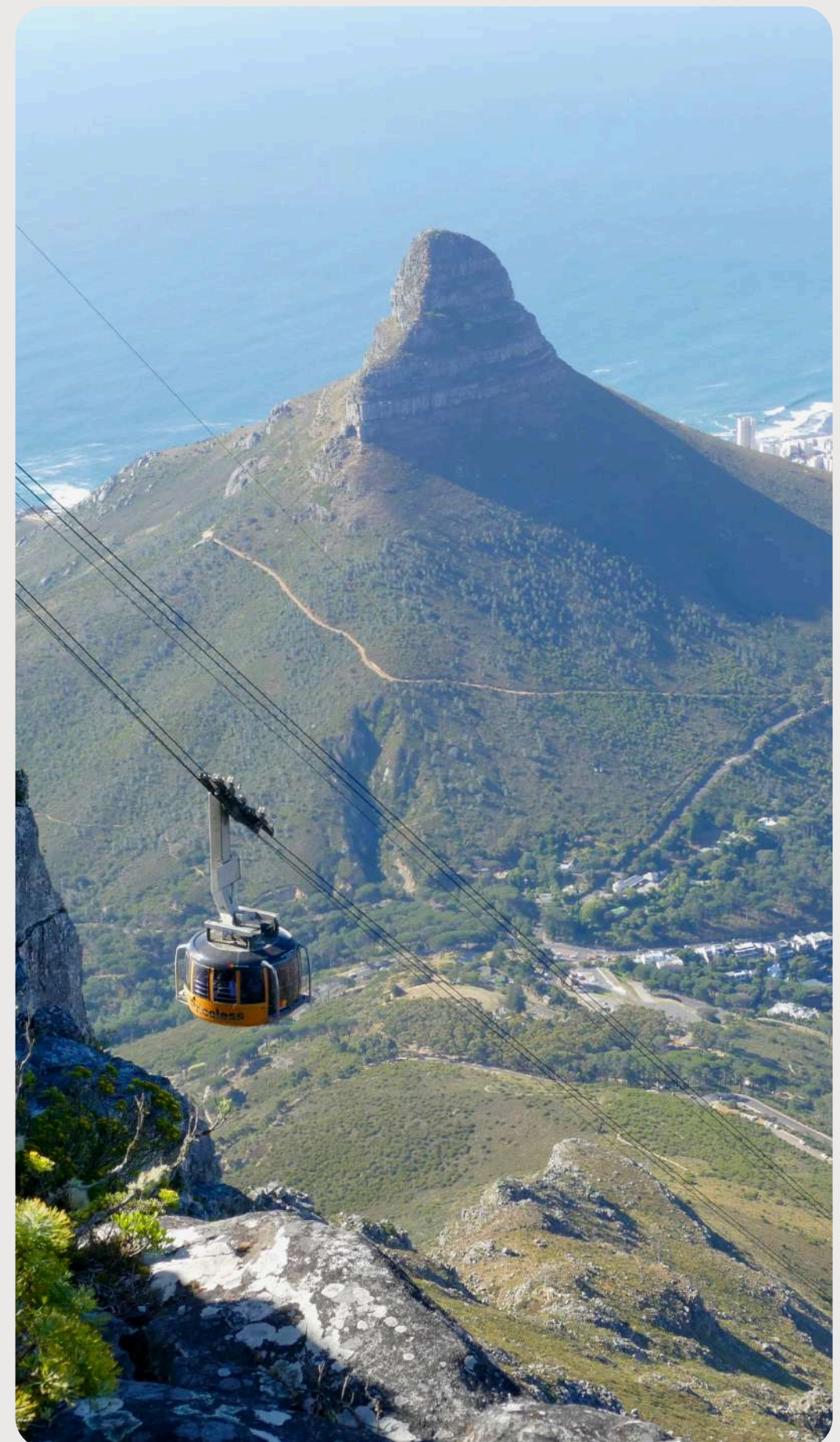
## Activities

### Sunset Champagne Cruise

- A Sunset Champagne Cruise is a relaxing way to end the day as you sail from the V&A Waterfront with beautiful views of Table Mountain and the Atlantic Ocean. Guests can enjoy a complimentary glass of bubbly while watching the sun dip below the horizon.

### Table Mountain Cableway

- The Table Mountain Aerial Cableway offers a smooth rotating cable car ride to the top, with a 360-degree rotating floor that ensures panoramic views.. From the summit you can enjoy panoramic views over the city, the ocean and the surrounding mountains.



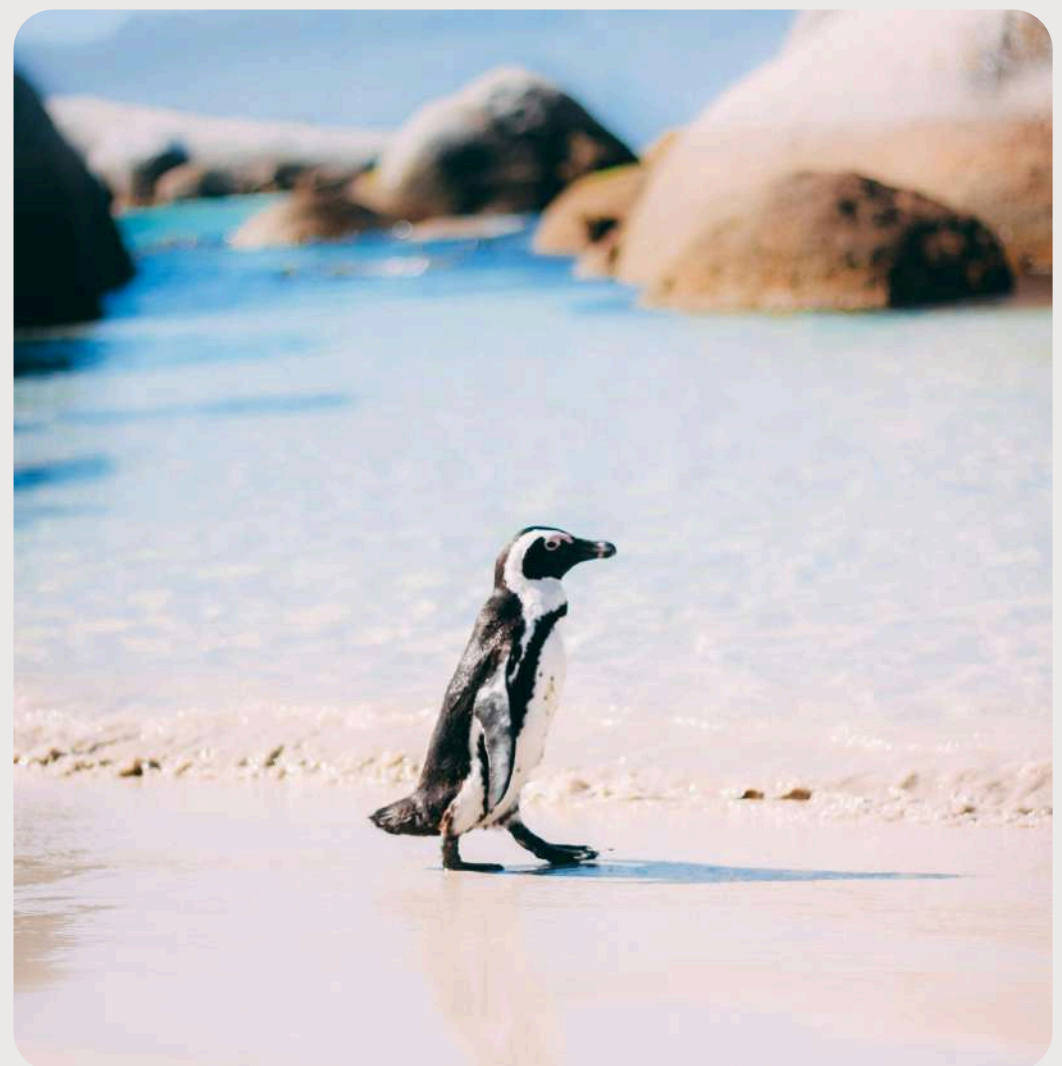
#### Bo-Kaap Walking Tour with Cape Malay Lunch

- A Bo-Kaap Walking Tour takes you through the colourful historic neighbourhood known for its rich cultural heritage. You will learn about the Cape Malay community's traditions and end the experience with an authentic Cape Malay lunch full of flavour. Along the way you will hear stories about the families who have lived there for generations and shaped the character of the area. The guide will point out significant landmarks and introduce you to the unique blend of architecture that makes Bo-Kaap so distinctive. It is a warm and welcoming cultural experience that gives you a deeper appreciation of Cape Town's diverse history.



#### Full Day Peninsula Excursion

- A Full Day Peninsula Excursion covers some of Cape Town's most spectacular coastal scenery with stops at Boulders Beach penguin colony, Cape Point and Simon's Town. Travellers can enjoy dramatic viewpoints, historic sites and incredible wildlife throughout the day. The route offers endless photographic opportunities as the road winds along rugged cliffs and pristine stretches of coastline. At Boulders Beach you can watch the endangered African penguins up close as they waddle along the sand and swim in the clear water. Cape Point provides sweeping views over the ocean with a chance to explore the old lighthouse and the wild fynbos landscape. The excursion also includes time in Simon's Town where visitors can enjoy its naval history and charming harbour area. It is a full and rewarding day that showcases the very best of the Cape Peninsula.

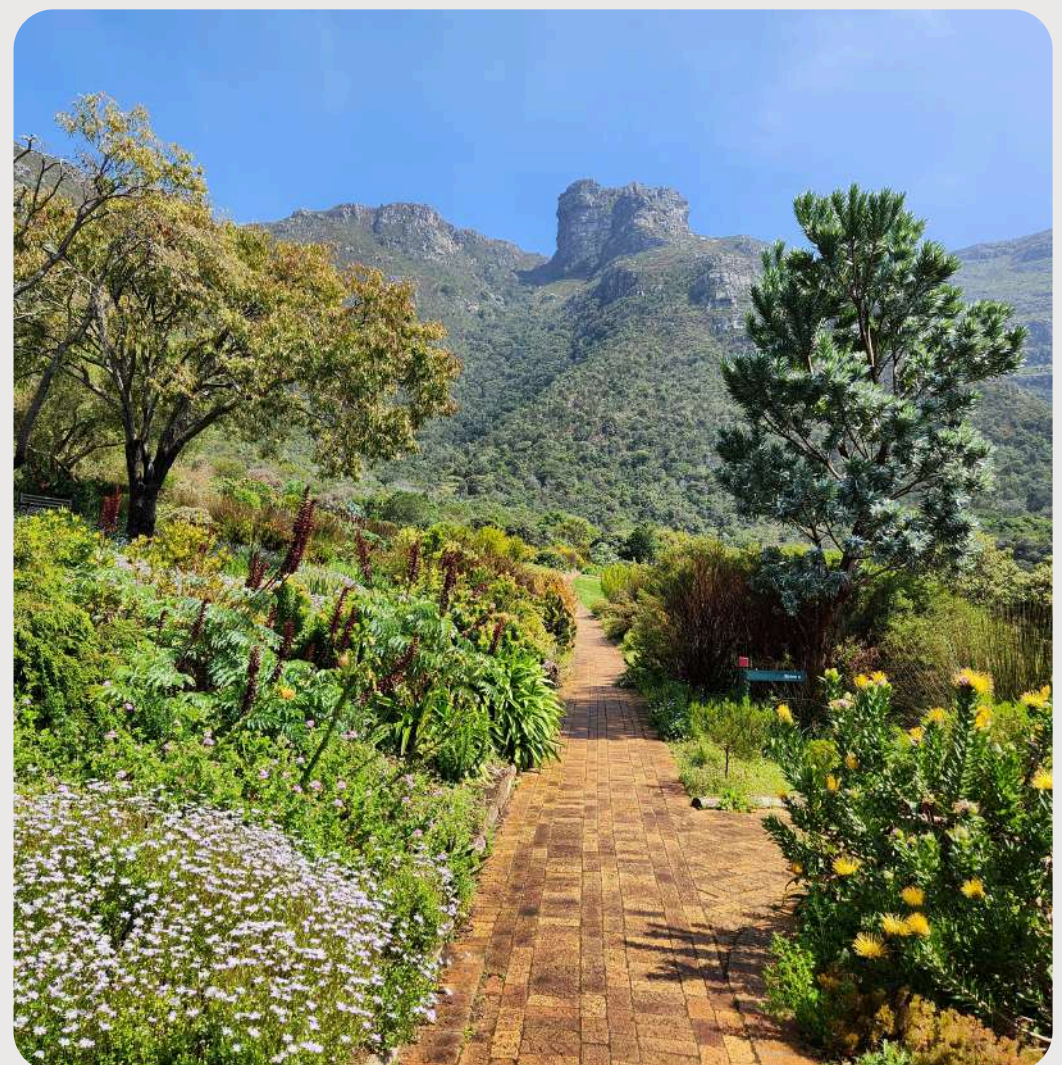


#### Robben Island

- A visit to Robben Island offers deep insight into South Africa's history as you explore the former prison where Nelson Mandela spent many of his years in captivity. The tour is led by former political prisoners, who share powerful, first-hand accounts.

#### Kirstenbosch National Botanical Garden

- Kirstenbosch Botanical Garden is one of the world's great botanical gardens set against the slopes of Table Mountain. Visitors can enjoy lush indigenous plant life and scenic walking paths including the popular Tree Canopy Walkway. Seasonal flower displays create bursts of colour throughout the year which makes every visit feel different. The peaceful setting is perfect for relaxed exploration and quiet appreciation of South Africa's unique biodiversity.



# FRANSCHHOEK

Franschhoek is the culinary and wine capital of South Africa. This small, elegant valley town sits at the heart of the Cape Winelands, surrounded by dramatic mountain scenery and is home to some of the finest wine estates and restaurants in the country. The town itself is charming and walkable, with excellent food, beautiful architecture and a history that stretches back to the Huguenot settlers of the 17th century.



## Accommodation

### Lavender Farm Boutique Guest House (2 Nights)

The Lavender Farm is the only guest house in the world set on a working lavender farm, a beautiful 3-hectare property situated just 2 km outside the village of Franschhoek. The guest house offers a peaceful and fragrant retreat with mountain views, gorgeous gardens and a warm, personal atmosphere.

## Activities

### Franschhoek Wine Tram

- The Franschhoek Wine Tram is the famous hop-on hop-off tram that winds through the valley stopping at celebrated wine estates along the route. It is one of the most enjoyable and relaxed ways to experience the wines and landscapes of Franschhoek. Each line follows a different route which gives you the chance to explore a variety of estates at your own pace. The tram offers beautiful open-air views of vineyards and mountains as you travel between stops. Many estates offer tastings, cellar tours and food pairings which create a full sensory experience. The day is completely flexible which means you can linger longer at the places you love. It is a fun and scenic way to soak up the charm of the Franschhoek valley.



# OUTTSHOORN

Oudtshoorn is the ostrich capital of the world, a sun-baked Karoo town tucked into the Little Karoo between the Swartberg and Outeniqua mountain ranges. It is a place of wide skies, ancient limestone caverns and extraordinary semi-arid landscapes. The town has a distinctive charm shaped by its history, natural wonders and long connection to the ostrich industry.

## Accommodation

### Buffelsdrift Game Lodge (2 Nights)

Buffelsdrift is a luxury game lodge set on a private 5-hectare dam, with beautifully appointed tented chalets overlooking the water. Hippos are regularly spotted from the viewing deck and giraffes roam the surrounding bush. The lodge has recorded over 217 bird species on the property, making it a remarkable destination in its own right.

## Activities

### Cango Caves

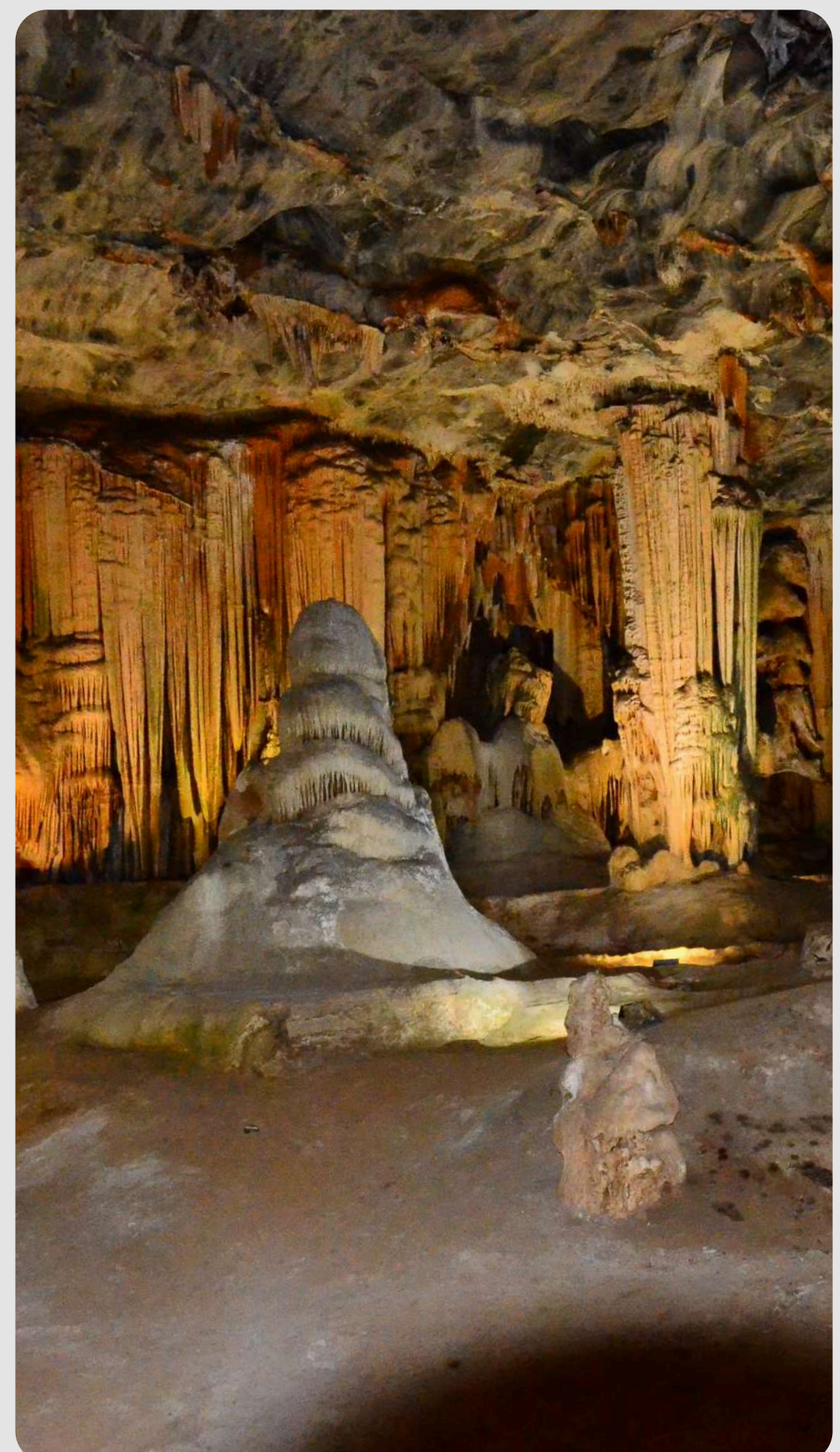
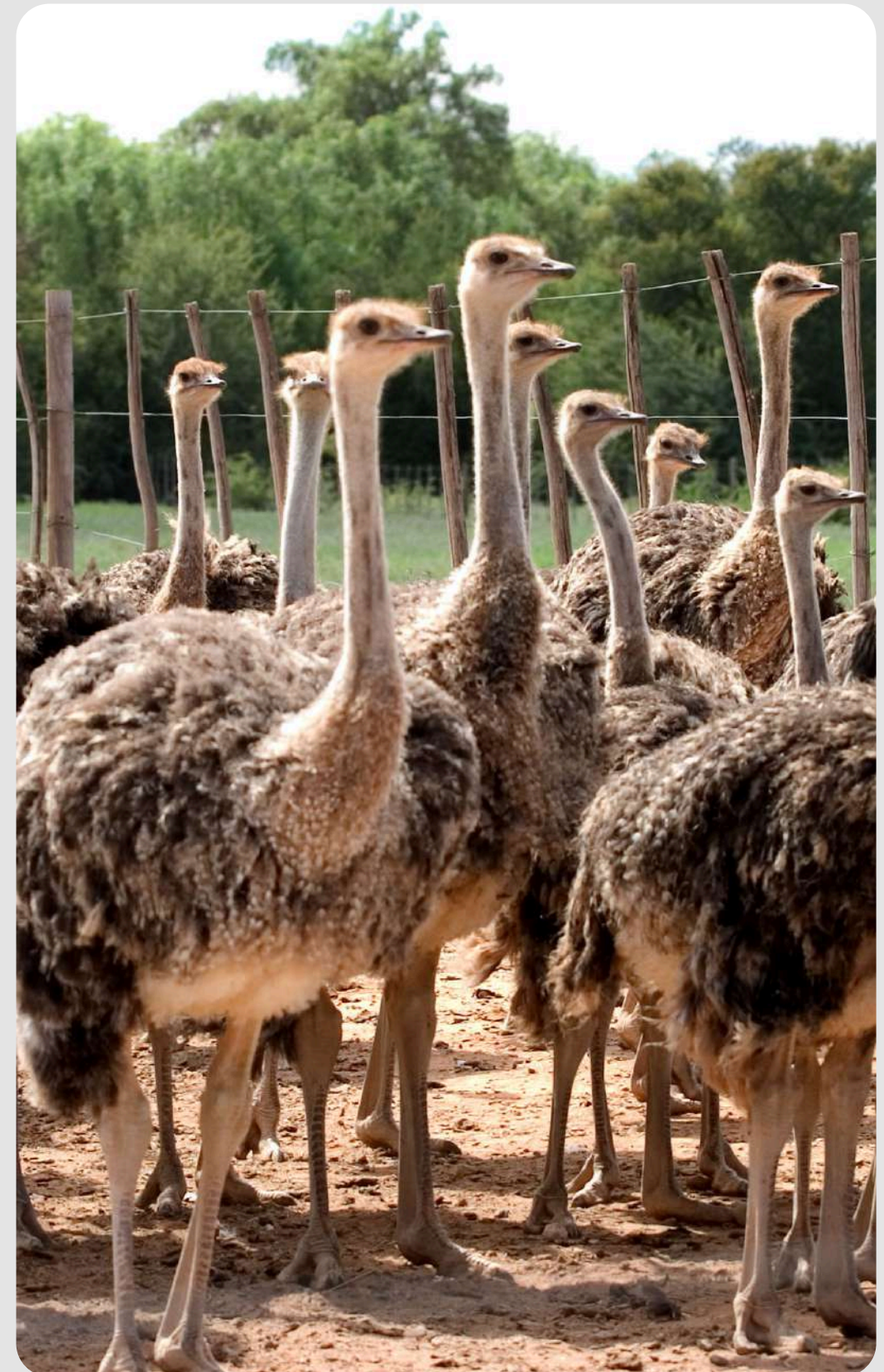
- The Cango Caves are among the most spectacular limestone cavern systems in the world carved over millions of years beneath the Swartberg Mountains. These vast chambers are filled with impressive stalactites and stalagmites that create an almost otherworldly atmosphere. Guided tours share the history of the caves and the early explorers who first mapped them.

### Cango Ostrich Show Farm

- A visit to a working ostrich farm lets you learn about the history of the ostrich feather industry that made Oudtshoorn famous. You can see how these remarkable birds are raised and cared for on the farm. The experience also includes interesting facts about their behaviour and the important role ostriches still play in the local economy.

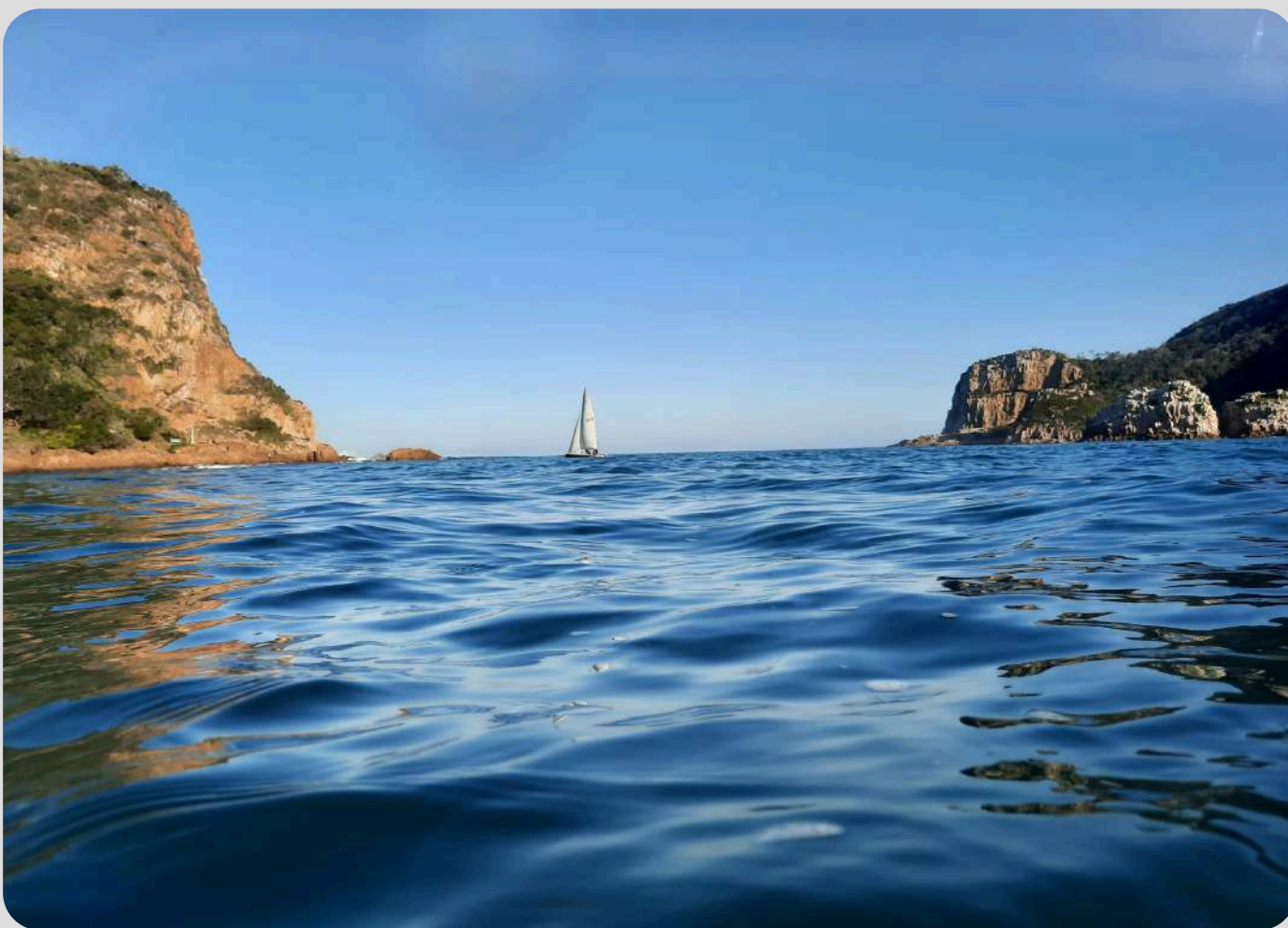
### Cango Wildlife Ranch

- Home to cheetah encounters and white lions among other remarkable wildlife experiences. The ranch offers an up close look at conservation efforts aimed at protecting endangered species. Visitors can learn about the work being done to safeguard these animals and the challenges faced in modern wildlife conservation.



# KNYSNA

Knysna is the jewel of the Garden Route, known for its natural beauty and welcoming atmosphere. Set around a tidal lagoon that opens to the sea through two dramatic sandstone cliffs called the Heads, it offers scenery that feels both peaceful and striking. The indigenous forests behind Knysna are rich in history and home to a wide variety of plant and animal life. These forests were once the roaming grounds of the last elephants of the region which adds a sense of mystery to the landscape. The waterfront area is lively with shops and cafés which makes it a pleasant place to explore at any time of day.



## Accommodation

### Bollard Bay House, Leisure Isle (2 Nights)

Accommodation is at a beautifully situated guesthouse on Leisure Isle, with sweeping views over Knysna Lagoon and the famous Heads. The property has two pools and a wonderfully relaxed atmosphere.

## Activities

### Knysna Elephant Park: Walking With Elephants

- Join guides at Knysna Elephant Park for an unforgettable walk alongside elephants in a controlled, free-range setting. The guides share stories about the elephants history and personalities which makes the encounter even more meaningful.

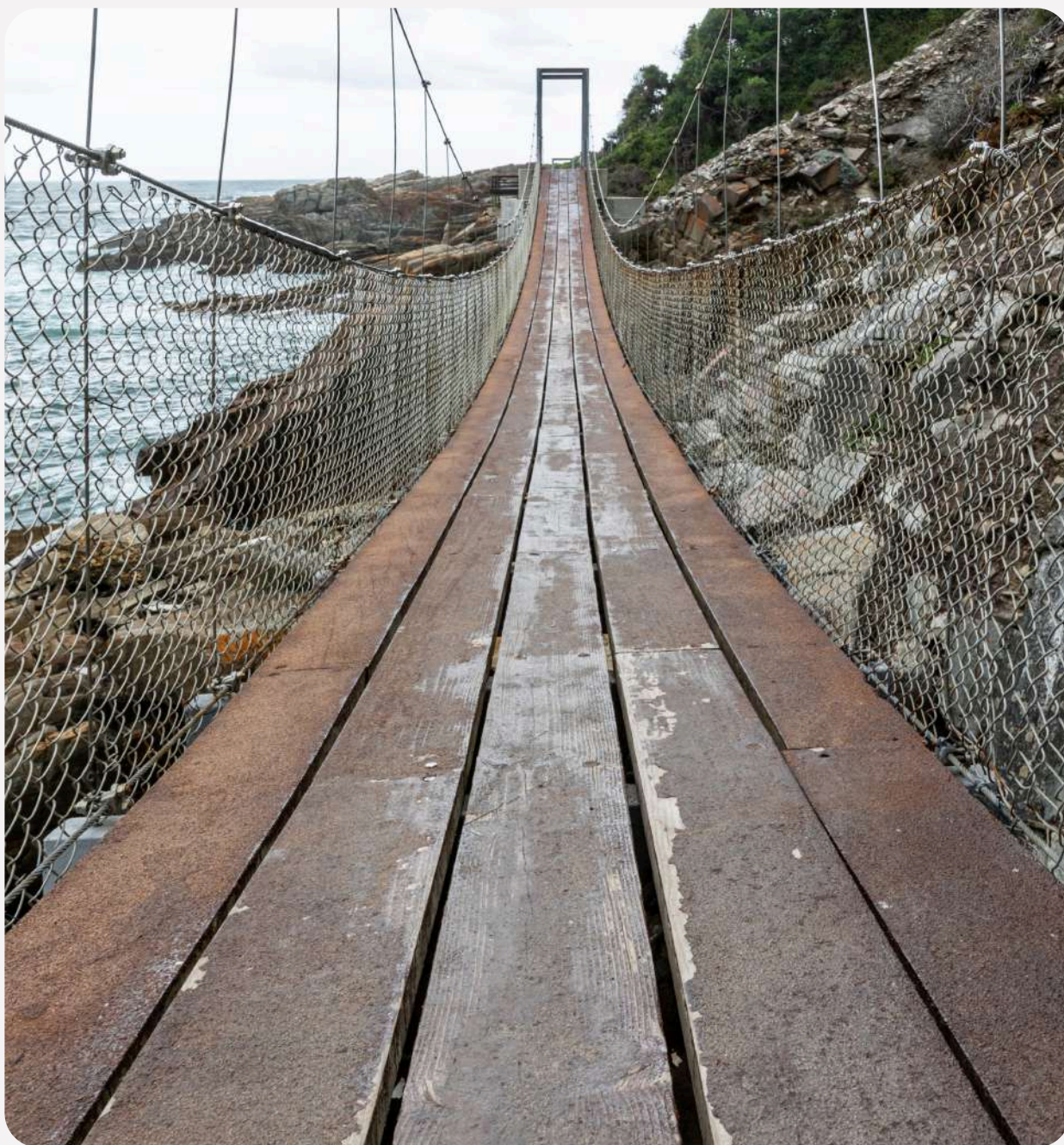
### Featherbed Eco Experience

- Take a guided boat trip across the Knysna Lagoon to the Western Head nature reserve, one of the finest private reserves on the Garden Route. The journey offers beautiful views of the lagoon, the Heads and the surrounding cliffs. Once you arrive at the reserve you can enjoy nature trails, viewpoints and unique coastal vegetation that make the experience both scenic and memorable.



# TSITSIKAMMA

Tsitsikamma is a region of towering forests, dramatic coastline and deep river gorges where the landscape feels both ancient and untouched. The mix of lush vegetation, rugged cliffs and powerful ocean swells creates a setting that is striking and memorable. As you move through the region you'll find sweeping views, rich birdlife and a strong feeling of being surrounded by nature at its most impressive.



## Accommodation

### The Fernery Lodge (1 Night)

The Fernery is one of the most dramatically situated lodges on the Garden Route, perched above a 30-meter waterfall in the Sanddrift River gorge. The lodge has 7 luxury suites, a spa, jacuzzi, sauna and pool, with views stretching across the river mouth and out over the Indian Ocean.

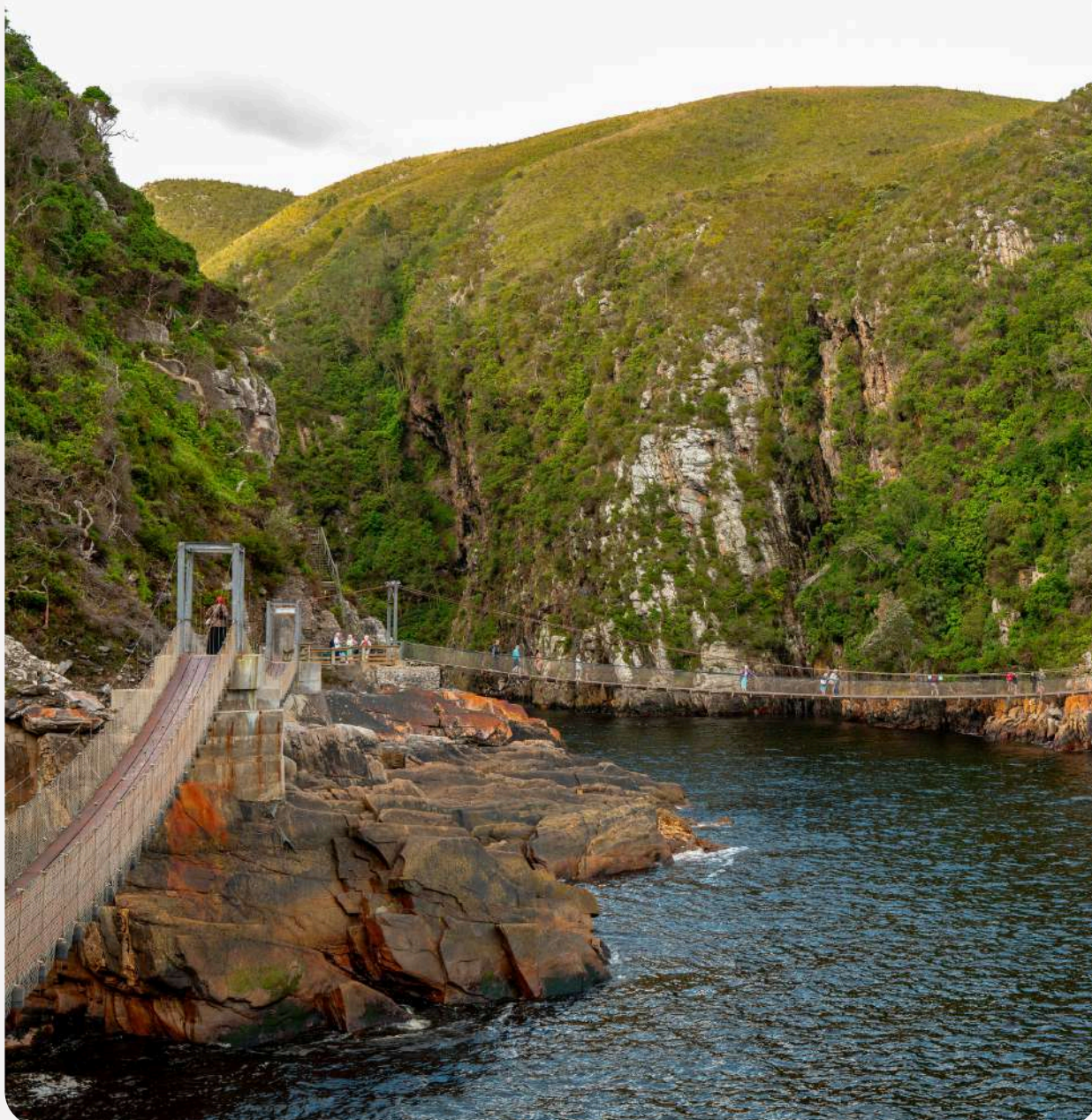
## Activities

### Storms River

- A visit to Storms River takes you on a beautiful walk through indigenous forest to the famous suspension bridge at the river mouth. The bridge spans the gorge above the swirling waters which creates a dramatic and unforgettable scene. Along the way you can enjoy rich birdlife and the fresh scent of the forest. The views from the bridge and the surrounding pathways show just how powerful and scenic this coastline is. It is an easy yet rewarding outing that captures the wild spirit of Tsitsikamma.

### Treetop Canopy Tour

- The Treetop Canopy Tour lets you zip-line through the upper canopy of an ancient forest on one of South Africa's most celebrated adventure activities. Each platform offers a different perspective of the towering trees and the lush greenery below. The guides share interesting facts about the forest ecosystem which adds depth to the experience. The zip-lines are smooth and scenic which makes the activity suitable for both first-timers and thrill-seekers. It is an exciting way to explore the forest from a completely different angle.



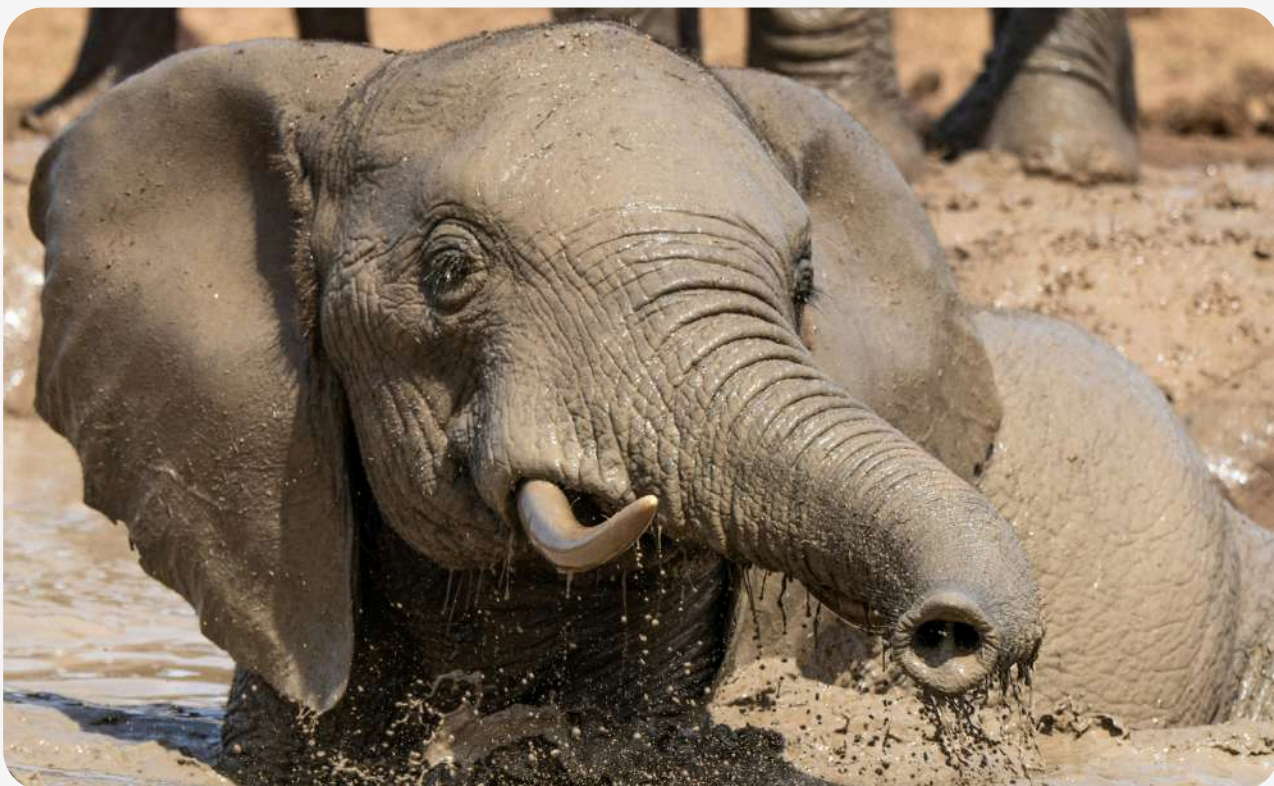
# ADDO

Addo Elephant National Park is the third largest national park in South Africa and home to over 800 elephants. The park also has lion, leopard, black rhino and buffalo, making it one of the few places on earth where you can see all of the Big Five in a malaria-free environment.

## Accommodation

### Hitgeheim Country Lodge (3 Nights)

Hitgeheim is set in the Sundays River Valley close to the main entrance of Addo Elephant National Park. The thatched chalets feature outdoor showers and private wooden decks that look out over the surrounding bush. The lodge has a walk-in wine cellar and two outdoor pools which create a relaxed and inviting atmosphere. It is a peaceful base with beautiful views and an emphasis on comfort and attention to detail.



## Activities

### Daily Game Drives in Addo Elephant National Park

Three days of guided exploration through one of the continent's great wildlife destinations. With over 800 elephants, lion, leopard, black rhino and buffalo every drive brings something remarkable. Each outing takes you through a variety of landscapes ranging from dense thicket to open plains which gives you the chance to see different species throughout the day.

The guides share insightful knowledge about animal behaviour, conservation and the history of the park which adds depth to every sighting.

Early mornings often bring beautiful light and increased wildlife activity which creates excellent photographic opportunities. As the day warms you may encounter herds gathering at waterholes or elephants moving between feeding areas.
